The Birth of Christ, from the Books of Matthew and Luke

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what ort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, And on earth peace among those whom he favors!

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

New Security System



The Board of Trustees is happy to announce that the installation of the new security system at Wesley Church has been completed. Fourteen cameras have been installed at various locations throughout the church — one focused on each entrance and others at strategic areas of the building. Three cameras are located outside of the church with two of those focusing on the church parking lot. Each camera will record motion and activity. It is hoped that the new system will deter

would-be intruders — but provide information if there is an intruder or vandal.

It is important that all church members are aware of the changes that accompany the new security system.

Please note that the doors to the church now will remain locked at all times, and only staff and those with a code will gain access to the building during a normal weekday. Visitors to the church will be "buzzed-in" either by the volunteer receptionist or the church administrative assistant. If you plan to come to the church during the week, as you enter at Murray Avenue, look for the button and speaker box to your left. This is where you will announce your presence. You will then be greeted, and you will be given access to the church.

As you plan to visit the church, remember the church office hours: Monday through Thursday the office hours are 8 a.m. - 12 noon and 1 - 5 p.m. On Friday, the office typically closes an hour earlier — 4 p.m. Keep in mind that no one will be available to "buzz-in" any visitors during the lunch hour from 12 noon - 1 p.m. Try to schedule visits to the church during the working hours of the office when staff and volunteers are at their desks.

While there has been some concern about entering the church for planned activities, please know that the church doors *will* be open on those occasions when there are Bible studies, meetings, and other events and activities at the church.

This new system will take some getting used to and, thus, the staff and the Board of Trustees ask your patience as the church moves forward with being more focused on the safety of those within the church walls.

Please Reserve Parking Along Third Street Help Wesley Church would like to accommodate those with physical limitations while also being mindful of those who are visiting.

On Sunday morning, please save the parking on Third Street for those who fit these categories.

From Pastor Mark's Desk

Emmanuel . . .

This name, meaning "God is with us," appears in The Book of Isaiah when the prophet announces God's promised presence with Israel. The name Immanuel, in its Hebrew spelling, reminds God's people that they are, in fact, God's people. It was a way of assuring those facing persecution that God was in their midst.

And then, in the first chapter of *Matthew*, the Gospel writer uses the name *Emmanuel*, now in its Greek spelling, to let his readers know that Isaiah's prophecy has been fulfilled in the person of Jesus. Just as Isaiah's words reassured the Israelites, so do Matthew's words reassure Christians that in the person of Jesus the Christ, *God is with us*.

This is the promise and hope that we are reminded of each December. With the journey of Advent, the celebration of Christmas, and the beginning of a new year, it is reinforced to us that God is here. No matter what journey we go on, God will be leading us, beside us, and behind us all the way.

What does this mean for us, then?

It means that the impossible has now become possible. It means that God, the Eternal One who can neither be created nor destroyed, has willingly subjected Godself to both birth and death. The omnipotent, omniscient, omnipresent Creator of the universe has taken on human skin, human frailties, and human limitations. And he has done all of this for you and me. He's done these things, and he's given his very life, so that you and I would no longer feel limited in what we can do.

It seems to me that sometimes we act as if God has not done all of these things for us. At least in my own life, at times I can get caught up in the belief that everything is up to me. If a good sermon is to be delivered on Sunday, I've got to do it on my own. If new members are going to come to Wesley, I've got to bring them in. Or, in the reverse, I fall into the trap of believing that if I can't do something, it can't be done.

And with all of these things, I might very well be correct. Except for the fact that roughly 2,000 years ago, the Eternal God, Creator of all things, put on human skin, was born in a manger, and made the impossible possible.

In an ordinary world, we would be bound by our own limitations. A good sermon would be solely based on my own intellect and skill at delivery. Growing our church, spiritually, numerically, and financially, would be up to us and our own abilities.

Thank God, we don't live in an ordinary world. After the events of that first Christmas Day, we now live in an extraordinary world. We now live in a world where we can do all things through Christ who gives us strength (Philippians 4: 13). We live in a world where what is impossible for mortals is possible for God (Luke 18: 27) and nothing will be impossible with God (Luke 1: 37). We live in a world in which God is with us. Let us never forget this miracle of Christmas.

I hope you'll be present this year for the many activities and worship opportunities here at Wesley Church. Be sure to invite a friend, as we'll be journeying again to Bethlehem on Sundays, and I'm looking forward to taking this journey with you for the first time. It's such a joy to be a part of the Wesley family. Thank you for all you do to share God's love!






